



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Your Summer beckons...



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

New 12 week mandatory deadline for final amended Education Health and Care Plans

If your child has been issued with an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP), the Local Authority (LA) must review it once a year. This is to make sure your child's needs are accurately recorded and that all provision required to meet them is included. This will take place at a meeting before which, documentation including up to date reports or medical evidence, should be circulated Following the meeting, the LA may decide to leave the plan as is, to make amendments or to discontinue it

If amendments are necessary, which is usually the case, the LA should send you a draft EHCP recording those amendments and invite comment, after which the EHCP will be made final (whether or not all or some of the proposed amendments have been included). Parents often wait months to receive an amended EHCP following annual review, which means that those working with the child only have the benefit of information which is out of date and no longer reflective of the child's needs or the provision required to meet them.

How long does the LA have, to provide the final amended EHCP after an annual review?

The recent case of R (L) v Devon CC has finally provided clarity for parents with Mrs Justice Foster DBE interpreting the LA duty - in fact she gave a simple, clear answer. In accordance with the judgment, the LA is under a duty to provide an amended final EHCP within 12 weeks of the date of the review meeting. Although the Judge appreciated that the LA was subject to limited resources, she confirmed that the 12-week deadline is mandatory in all circumstances.

Should a LA not issue the amended plan within 12 weeks of the date of the review meeting, parents can challenge this by judicial review. If the deadline is approaching, parents should remind the LA of the timeframe imposed and the deadline for issuing the final EHCP as clarified in R (L) v Devon CC.

Although we at Tees have seen many parents who have waited far longer than the 12-week deadline (indeed in some cases as long as 11-12 months or more), we hope that LAs will take heed of this ruling and start issuing final amended EHCPs within the law. We will continue to monitor whether LAs are keeping to this timeframe and are available to help parents, should this not be the case.



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


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
Books which encourage children to put their books down and go outside

Hooray! Summer is here and we have the chance to get out and about whether we're in our own back gardens, local parks, or further afield. I thought I would review some fun picture books to inspire children to spend time outside and engage with and value their surroundings, wherever they are.




Old Macdonald had a Phone by the superlative partnership of Jeanne Willis and Tony Ross is a sly reminder for children that life passes you by when you spend too much time on your mobile phone. In the rhythms, and with all the fun of the animal noises, of the original children's song, the book tells the story of what happened when Farmer Macdonald accidentally bought 100 mobile phones online, which all his animals helped themselves to. Things go wrong. In one example, 'The hens wouldn't lay, On their phones all day, Here a tweet, there a chat, WhatsApping

the farm cat'. Farm life comes to a halt. So Old Macdonald confiscates all the phones. Also not good: The fox scared the sheep, the rooster stayed asleep, the bull refused to sweep his manure in a heap'. Eventually a good balance of phone usage is agreed, and all is happy again. What a great and hilarious starting point for family discussions about regulating screen use during the holidays or, indeed, on day trips to the farm!



Benjamin Zephaniah has written Nature Trail, illustrated by Nila Aye, a charming celebration of nature to inspire very young children to look around them once they are outside. His message is that 'When you have a garden, you will never be alone' as there are so many little creatures to watch, including baby daddy long legs, 'easy-going snails', and


squirrels which 'come to nick my nuts'. While the humorous busy colourful illustrations are not naturalistic (the baby daddy longlegs is in a pram, for example) they offer lots of 'spot the ...' opportunities and provide all sorts of ideas for activities for children from planting and growing beans, to installing a bird bath, or simply sitting and reading under a tree. For young children who may be nervous of 'creepy crawlies' this book offers lovely encouragement to go looking for them.



Older children, or those perhaps going abroad this summer, might be interested in Around the World in 80 Trees by Ben Lerwill and Kaja Kajfez which takes readers on a

journey across the continents illustrating their native trees, complete with all sorts of fascinating facts. Did you know, for example, that the Whistling Thorn tree of East Africa is so-called because the ants which live inside its hollow thorns make little exit holes when they tunnel out – through which the wind whistles! How urgently, now, do you want to go to East Africa to hear that for yourself? Even if there are no significant travel plans on your horizon, some of the amazina trees

in the book have been planted in botanic gardens around this country so you can go and find them closer to home. The book also includes simple explanations of pollination, of the importance of trees to the environment, to the many uses to which we put trees and their products (like maple syrup and cocoa), and to some of the spiritual significance of some trees (oaks, for example, are linked with two of the mightiest figures from mythology, Zeus and Thor). It will inspire children to do further research and, I hope, to look out for trees (in all senses of that phrase).



Some children may be going to the seaside. If you are, that's wonderful. If you are not, the classic Winnie and Wilbur at the Seaside

by Valerie Thomas and Korky Paul is a wonderfully disenchanted cats-eye view of the charms of the beach which may help children feel that they are not necessarily missing out! Poor Wilbur can't swim, doesn't like water, and hates getting wet. He ends up 'very wet, very sandy, and rather squashed' after one of Winnie's trademark disasters and is extremely relieved when Winnie heads for home and magics up a swimming pool instead. If you haven't yet discovered

the Winnie and Wilbur series, you are in for a treat – gloriously quirky stories with even more gloriously quirky illustrations to feast on.



An entertaining but also sobering story about the seaside which will encourage children to look around them on the beach is Ducks Overboard: A True Story of Plastic in our Oceans by Markus Motum. You may remember the shipping container of plastic ducks which fell off the side of a ship in the Pacific and broke open, releasing thousands of plastic ducks which began bobbing across the waves. This picture book tells the story of one of those ducks, weaving the disturbing facts about plastic waste in our oceans into the narrative, as, for example, when the duck is swirled into the 'Great Pacific Garbage Patch', an island of plastic rubbish twice the size of Texas in the middle of the ocean. The story is gently and simply told, with an additional factual sub-text appearing in a smaller font on each page. The beautiful and bright illustrations provide drama and there is an optimistic ending with

suggestions of how children can help. Summer is often when children spend time at summer camps where they have the opportunity to try new sports. Sports are Fantastic Fun by Ole Konnecke has some great suggestions. detailing, as the blurb on the back says. the highs and lows of sports from around the world. With witty illustrations reminiscent of Richard Scarry's comic style, this is a delight, even if you don't move from your armchair. With another hat on. I am a coach for a junior rowing sauad, so I was particularly pleased to see my minority sport included, even if the commentary is slightly less than enthusiastic: 'Rowing is fun too. You can sit comfortably on the shore with your

picnic, cheering on the rowers when they fly past at full speed'. I hope that at

I hope that at least one of these books will appeal to the children in your care –



and that they have the desired effect of encouraging those children to put down their books and go outside. All are on the shelves at Hart's Books in Saffron Walden (www.hartsbooks.co.uk), along with hundreds of other titles to entertain and inspire.



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

Blueberry Lavender Filling

(This makes more filling than is needed to fill 8 pop tarts)

Ingredients:

150a fresh blueberries 100g sugar 1 tbs cornflour 1 tbs hot water mixed together with 34 tbs crushed lavender a couple pinches of salt water, as needed, 1tbs at a time **Directions:**

First, make the filling over a medium heat, add the sugar and blueberries and sugar to a pot. Heat until sugar is dissolved. Add the starch and continuously stir. Add a couple of pinches of salt and cool.

Pop Tart Pastry Ingredients:

315g plain flour

34 teaspoon salt

2 tbs granulated sugar

130g unsalted butter iced water

2 egg yolks

4 tbs milk

vanilla extract

Directions:

- Make the pop tart dough by pulsing the flour, salt, sugar, butter, egg yolk and milk in a food processor.
- Once combined, halve the dough and shape into two disks. Cover and refrigerate for an hour.
- Roll the dough into a large rectangle.

- Place half the dough rectangles onto a baking tray, then spoon the blueberry mixture in the middle
- Top the other rectangles of dough on top and seal with fingers.
- Chill in the freezer for 2 hours, then bake at fan 190°C until golden.

Then slice them into smaller rectangles

Lavender Icina: 192a icina sugar 192ml milk

1/2 this Layender to taste (crushed with hands)

Directions:

Mix all the ingredients together and whisk. Make sure the consistency is perfectly smooth, but very thick so it doesn't slide off the pop tart. Add more icing sugar if needed. Use the crushed lavender to sprinkle on the top



Home-Start Essex offer a free, confidential family support service including home-visiting, family groups, well-being, as well as a specialised service in behaviour support. Home-Start's unique emotional, practical and friendship support to families has been running for over 30 years and is recognised internationally as an effective means of family support. Working together with families, we can provide friendship, practical support, a listening ear; encouragement that builds up strength and emotional well-being, and improved connections to widen networks of relationships and support.

Our **home-visiting** volunteers come from all walks of life, and all have experience of being parents themselves or working with children. They are friendly and caring and want to do their best to support local families. They are reliable, trustworthy and adopt our non-judgemental approach. In addition, they are all fully trained and checked with the Disclosure Barring Service (DBS).

Our **Family group** offers friendly support to families with young children. We provide an opportunity for parents to meet to support each other and to give their children the opportunity to play together and make friends. Our group also supports parents through our School and Nursery Readiness Program with their child's transition from being at home, to going to nursery or

school. We offer a 6-week structured programme, linked to the Early Years Foundation Stage, which provides a stimulating learning environment and activities for children to learn through play and help to assist them start nursery/school ready to learn, and to reach their full potential.

The aim of our **Wellbeing Group** is to provide a relaxed safe space to talk about any difficulties being experienced such as low self-esteem, anxiety, sleep deprivation, feeling isolated or panic attacks. The group is led by our Well-being Coordinator. The group allows parents to meet likeminded adults and enjoy one another's company, whilst learning more about the issues we all deal with on a day-to-day basis. This will include working on strategies that will give the tools to help cope in stressful situations.

The group will run over 6 sessions, allowing everyone to get to know each other, and feel relaxed and comfortable enough to break down the barriers we sometimes build up. Topics covered over the 5 sessions with Group discussion: managing anxiety/stress – relaxation techniques; emotional wellness strategies; building confidence and self-esteem; improving communication skills.

Our **behavioural support advisor** can support and offer parents behaviour advice where there is a child presenting with additional needs.

Thaxted Rangers. The Home of Fair Play.



A couple of weeks ago, I was having a conversation with one of our coaches. She relayed to me a discussion she'd had with a new parent, who had told her that our inclusivity and ethos were the defining factors in her choosing our club for her son. It was an incredibly proud moment for me and the club

Four years ago, we were just beginning the revival of youth football in Thaxted. The club's youth provision had dwindled significantly and we were fielding just one remaining team. Then, somewhat unexpectedly, a group of parents

approached Martin Tritton (now Club Chairman), about forming a new team for their children. It was the start of something far bigger and far more important than any of us could have imagined.

The new committee had very clear expectations about how the club would move forward. We were determined that our philosophy would be child-centred and focused on inclusivity and fair play. Martin, with his extensive coaching and mentoring experience, had once come across a coaching mantra by Ben Bartlett, "the best coach mentor" he says, that he ever met. Having struck a chord, it became the foundation of our club ethos. At Thaxted Rangers, we will:

- 1. Have fun and be inclusive
- 2. Focus on development
- 3. Play to win- but **NEVER AT THE EXPENSE OF 1 OR 2.**

Number 3 is a bonus, of course, But on points 1 and 2, we were uncompromising. As the club has grown (and it has done so at an exponential rate), one thing we have continued to emphasise is that coachina children is very different from elite sports. They are two separate entities entirely. In England, grassroots football doesn't even become competitive until U12. In our opinion, the priority of youth football should never be solely about winning but about developing young players who love the game more than they love trophies. To do that you need to have a holistic approach that considers every child and their needs, you need to create a supportive training and matchday environment where children are not



afraid to make mistakes, but instead, play with freedom and bravery, and without fear of experimenting.

The FA is also putting increasing focus on this concept. In 2018 they published their '12 Rules for Youth Football' which encourages coaches to move away from directing play from the sidelines and instead promotes a line of questioning that encourages young players to think for themselves. There are also rules pertaining to equal play-time and an "all positions rule" affirming that children must be given regular experience playing in all positions, including goalkeeper. These are all recommendations that make complete sense to us. Your less experienced players don't get better sitting on the bench, while you field your strongest team. They develop by playing, participating, and by being allowed to take risks and learn. We don't ever want children at our club to feel second best, so we don't have A/B teams, and we don't

have subs-instead, we have "aamechangers". For us, the indicator of a good coach, and a good club, is that *ALL*of our children develop, have fun, and most importantly, keep wanting to come back. The fact that we are about to form our 11th team in 4 years, with mixed teams that include airls and boys, and waiting lists for all age groups, is a true reflection of the commitment and success of our club We place areat importance on ensuring we have the right coaching teams in place because when children know you care about them, when vou're excited and enthusiastic, their experience is going to be one they remember and draw benefit from their whole life through. It isn't always about technical knowledge. children learn far more from who you are and *how* you coach, than *what* vou coach.

It certainly hasn't always been an easy path, but we believe that we have forged a place for ourselves in the grassroots community as a home for opportunity, fairness, and patience; a place where children, whatever their ability or background can discover a lifelong love for the beautiful game. It is a place we are extremely proud of. As we close the 21/22 season and move into the next, we have more children registered at TRFC than at any point in its history.

Now we just need to find more pitches!

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


