As you will see we have introduced a lot of changes and one of the most important is that we won't be making a charge for families to attend our service for the foreseeable future. This is because we know how much the financial crisis is going to impact families in the coming months and we felt that it will be vital that an organisation like ours that works at grass roots level in the community is able to support parents emotional wellbeing without the barriers of cost.

We anticipate that this new initiative will cost approximately £10k per year to our organisation but feel that it is vital that families receive positive support over the autumn and winter and we will make up the shortfall through additional funding bids, events and donations.

Divorce mediation. A quick guide

Difficulty in a relationship is one of the top causes of major stress. Anyone struggling with separation or divorce knows the impact that it can have on you and the other people in your family. Mediation is a process which can be used to reduce conflict and find a resolution – potentially more quickly and with less stress than by other means.

How does mediation work?

A trained mediator talks to both of you, separately at first, to fully understand what each of you would like to achieve. They are independent and will focus on enabling you both to communicate what you want to say and then move on to meet together, with the mediator present in the room. Their aim is to help you to find a fair resolution that you can both agree upon.

As well as listening to you, a mediator will set out how you and your ex-partner will work together at the mediation sessions, so that you can both speak to each other with respect, with a view to keeping things calm and constructive. The mediator can then record this information and give each of you a copy; this gives each of you reassurance that both your opinions have been heard and documented. You don't have to go to a mediator to resolve issues arising out of separation, but if you do end up going to Court, you usually have to show evidence that you have already tried mediation. There are some exemptions – that is situations where you are not required to have tried mediation.

Benefits of mediation

It's often a good idea to at least explore mediation as an option because there are important benefits which could make things easier for you, such as:

- you get to choose what is important to be discussed
- it can help with communication for future coparenting
- the timings are chosen by you
- · you make the final decisions, rather than a judge
- it is often quicker, taking weeks rather than months
- it can be cheaper.

At the end of your mediation

You will both be provided with a 'memorandum of understanding' which is a document setting out the basis of the arrangement you have reached as a solution. However, if your case involves money or property it's a good idea to take it to a solicitor and ask them to turn it into a 'consent order'. This is an order which sets out the arrangements and is confirmed by the Court so that it becomes legally binding.

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Welcome to the World! Books about sharing the world's joys

'Welcome to the world. Welcome to the light. Welcome to the day. Welcome to the night.'



This is the joyful rhyme which greets a new baby at the start of *Welcome to the World* by Julia Donaldson and Helen Oxenbury. Taking on the mantle from Shirley Hughes,

these award-winning creators know what matters in a young child's world, and they phrase and illustrate those things exquisitely beautifully. And so, we have 'Welcome to your mummy, Welcome to your feeds. Welcome to the earrings and the buttons and the beads.' There are glasses to pull off noses, strawberries and grapes, baths and nappies, ducks and swans, and many more simple delights, all in gentle rhyming text with equally gentle pictures to go with it. A perfect lullaby story for the youngest children.

Sharing the world's joys is a key theme of *Emma's Sunflower* by Phillipa Warden and Grace Ward. After the success of Rupert's Snowman, written for her son (which I reviewed last year), it was only a matter of time before Phillipa, creative to her fingertips, wrote a book to celebrate her daughter Emma's experiences too. In



this story, there is a hungry crow who doesn't share, but who inadvertently brings unexpected joy and a birthday surprise. Emma has filled a birdfeeder with sunflower seeds

for the family of greenfinches in her garden. But the crow swoops down, scares off the little birds, and gorges greedily on the seeds, scattering many on the ground. Of course, nature's magic happens, the seeds germinate, and, on Emma's next birthday, to her delight, there is a sunflower full of seeds and the greenfinch family returns. A gorgeous story about nature, about sharing, and about hope.

Grace, the illustrator, is dyslexic, so she and Phillipa have worked to make this book as accessible as possible for those who find reading tricky. Grace says it is important to her that the illustrations speak louder than the text so that the reader aets an instant understanding of the narrative And it works I like her soft sketchy illustrations in colours to match the passing of the seasons. They grow dark as the crow arrives, and then lighten and brighten again with the Spring – and then Phillipa and Grace have used a special font, designed to help dyslexic readers anchor the words. If all this care and attention to detail wasn't enough. Phillipa has also designed a host of activities for readers including a recipe for sunflower bread, a template for a bird mobile, ideas for painting paper

sunflower plates, with glued-on seeds, ideas for planting some seeds and making a photographic sunflower diary. There's a lot to be shared and enjoyed here.

Even a potato can bring joy and be shared. As a pet. *The Pet Potato* by Josh Lacey and Momoko Abe is simply wonderful. Albert desperately wants a pet, but his parents say no to all his suggestions. One day his father gives him



a present. It is a potato. "You wanted a pet," Dad said, "There you go.". At this point I was ready to flatten Dad for his unkindness, but Albert is more

forgiving. He puts the potato on the table and gets on with what he was doing. The next page is simply perfect in its simplicity and its matching of text to picture. Three short sentences: 'Potatoes can't look sad. Or lonely. But somehow this one did'. The double-page illustration is dark-coloured with a huge expanse of empty space between Albert's wondering face and an equally sad-looking potato with perfectly positioned eyes.

Albert includes his pet potato in all his games. It rides on his train track, goes to the library and the playground with him, sits on the edge of his bath, sleeps on his pillow, but a few days later it disappears. Albert is distraught. Eventually he discovers Mum has thrown it away as it has grown smelly and mouldy. (Where did poor kind Albert get these parents from?!). Albert insists on rescuing the

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potato and giving it a proper burial. The inevitable happens and Albert can share his pet potato harvest with everyone from his friends to the postman. I absolutely loved this story – but an example of good parenting it definitely is not! Finding the right world to be joyful in can be difficult. In Lucy Cousins' A Good Place, a band of insect friends are looking for a good place to live. Bee wants flowers, Ladybird wants leaves, Beetle wants dead wood, and Dragonfly wants a pond. Each time they think they have found the perfect spot, the close-up illustration draws back and we see why



that spot is wrong. The bright flowers they find are on a busy pavement with a big boot about to step on them; the 'pond' turns out to be a

dirty puddle on a road; when they land on what look like nice juicy leaves, someone sprays them with 'Bug Off'. Eventually they find a wonderful garden designed with them in mind and they are happy.

Young children will enjoy Lucy Cousins' trademark bright bold illustrations and the repetitive text, shouting out 'Oh no! This is NOT a good place' every other page, subtly teaching them the importance of protecting habitats for all. Pure nostalgia for my next choice, *Around the World with Ant and Bee* by **Angela Banner**, in which Ant and Bee are also looking around the world for something. Antony Horowitz says these

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were the books which taught him how to read, and it was the same for me. First published in 1960, they are very oldfashioned, aently and wittily humorous, and still work perfectly. The series is designed for shared reading. Adults read the text in black but the words in red are



for children to call out. Often there's a symbol (in this case an umbrella) in the text so children can follow the

lines and call out when that appears as well

Ant gives Bee an umbrella as a present. but Bee loses it on a windy day. He is distraught and so the pair decide to go and find it. They start by flying to Spain, because of the saving 'Rain, rain, go to Spain'. There are lovely illustrations of Spain and its people, but no umbrella, so they fly on to country after country, each with a briaht and lively illustration within the outline of the country's map. Bee gets tired so they go to India by camel 'because Bee said his winas were hot'. Eventually they find the umbrella but that's not auite the end of the story and I'm not going to spoil it for you as it is such a delightful twist. The last couple of pages include a picture of a alobe to show the journey and a map in which each of the countries visited is coloured and can be spotted and identified with reference back to the earlier illustrations. There's a lot of education aoina on here which children will pick up without realising – and a lot of iov!

There's more of the world's joys in Lunch at 10 Pomegranate Street: a Collection of Recipes to Share by Felicita Sala. What a lovely idea this book is! On each double-page spread there is someone in their kitchen preparing one of their national dishes and an easy-to-follow recipe for that dish. There are lots of clues in the illustrations as to what that nationality is. For example, Mr Sinah's kitchen has a painting on the wall behind

Ganoush: Miss Ishida is reaching for a bottle of Mirin to make Ovako Don. At the end of the book we discover that all these people are neighbours preparing dishes to share at a picnic. 'Pull up a chair and arab a plate! Everybody's welcome at 10 Pomearanate Street'. Story, world recipe book, celebration of sharing – what's not to like?! The book is dedicated to Felicita's mother, 'whose house is always open, whose table is always full'. What a joy!

I hope that you will be inspired to read at least one of these aoraeous books which are full of warmth and kindness and joy and more than a little bit of learning, too! All are on the shelves at Hart's Books in Saffron Walden (www.hartsbooks.co.uk) and other good bookshops.

Bonfire Night! Stay safe!!

- Keep a bucket of water nearby in case of a malfunctioning firework.
- Be sure to set off the fireworks in an area clear of people.
- Fireworks should only be lit in a designated area away from homes and other buildings, trees and cars.
 Never light fireworks on the grass, but always on a smooth, flat surface such as concrete or the pavement.
- If a firework does not ignite, do not attempt to re-light it. Wait at least 15 minutes before you investigate.
- Never allow children to touch, handle or light fireworks.
- Pet owners need to take special precaution in keeping their pets safe.
- Sparklers can be just as dangerous. Always light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves
- Never give sparklers to the under fives

- they will not understand how to use them safely. Always supervise children using sparklers. Give children gloves to wear when holding sparklers. Avoid dressing children in loose or flowing clothes as they may catch fire. Show children how to hold sparklers away from their bodies and at arm's length. Teach them no to wave sparklers near anyone else or run while holding them

A SPOOKY

If you aren't familiar with the term Charcuterie, it is essentially a fancy way to describe a meat and cheese board. This fun and spooky twist on a classic elegant cheese board is an impressive appetiser with meat, crackers, fruit, spreads and much more! Any one can give this a try.

Its the small touches and little details that transform this classic charcuterie board into the perfect halloween themed cheese board. After you have grabbed all your meats, cheese, crackers and fruit grab some cute spiders, a few small white and orange pumpkins from Hatters Farm and a few sweetie eye balls. You could really go the extra mile and buy a coffin miniature box and weave some fake spider webs around the edges to use as your cheese board base.

To get started you really need a big board, any shape will do. Arrange a few small bowls around the board and sprinkle pumpkin seeds around your cheeseboard to start a trail. You will want to use your largest fruit to centre the board. This is most likely to be a bunch or grapes. Add 2-3 smaller piles of fruit around the board as well. Cherries, apples, berries and dried fruit such as apricots or raisins.

Now Start to add your cheese. Scatter pieces of hard cheese like Cheddar, Manchego, Gruyere around the board and add some softer cheese like Brie, Chèvre, Roquefort, Gorgonzola etc. We made our Brie into a coffin shape and added a dollop of red raspberry jam on the top!

CHARCUTERIE

Now its time to layer your crackers and bread. Its always nice to add a variety of crackers. Whole wheat crackers and water crackers are typically my go-to. Try to form a curved line with your crackers and bread. This will help to create a flow that will carry your eyes around the board.

Now add your cured meats to fill in any large gaps that you have. I like to go for thinly sliced meats like

prosciutto. With your smaller bowls you can add spreads like fig jam, pumpkin hummus, herbed dip etc. Make sure the board is abundant with a variety of foods. If you have any spaces just fill these with olives, nuts, bell pepper strips, cherry tomatoes or slices of cucumber.

It's a great way to get creative and produce a work of art on your own. It doesn't have to cost the earth, and it will be a real show stopper for a halloween dinner party or event. You might also like to try and do a kids sweetie board. Follow us on social media this month to see some ideas.

We have been a quiet and subtle presence in Bishop's Stortford and the surrounding area for 22 years, offering a safe space on Saturday mornings where

children can meet, talk and play with a parent (or sometimes other family members) who no longer live with them. We were The Portland Child Contact Centre but we are now a registered charity with a new name – the Bishop's Stortford Child Contact Centre, registered charity number 1198383.

Contact sessions are typically offered twice per month for two hours on Saturday mornings and take place in a large church hall in the centre of Bishop's Stortford. We have plenty of toys and games for all ages.

Our youngest child at present is just one year old and the oldest thirteen years. We have Lego, crafts, card games, dressing

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up clothes, hoola hoops, scooters, books and plenty more!

Families may refer themselves, or be referred by family law solicitors, social workers or the courts.

If parents prefer not to meet each other, arrival and leaving times are staggered and different entrances used.

We've had some very appreciative comments from families over the years -

'I would like to thank you all so very much for all that you do and enabling me to spend precious time with my daughters. I owe you all a debt.'

'From my view I think this place is fantastic and it was a pleasure to come to this place.'

We are currently all volunteers, but advice from the National Association of Child Contact Centres is that we must plan towards operating in future with at least one paid member of staff. We are therefore working hard to attract funding from local and national organisations and individuals. This will allow us to offer a wider range of services – perhaps including after-school sessions and opportunities for separated parents to meet others in the same situation.
